Andy Grove, Intel’s chairman, once said that fast means that whatever happens happens in the blink of an eye.

What matters most won’t be the megahertz rating of your computer’s CPU or the size of the box (though it will be smaller, for sure) but what your PC will do for you. You're going to be late again. Hurry up!
